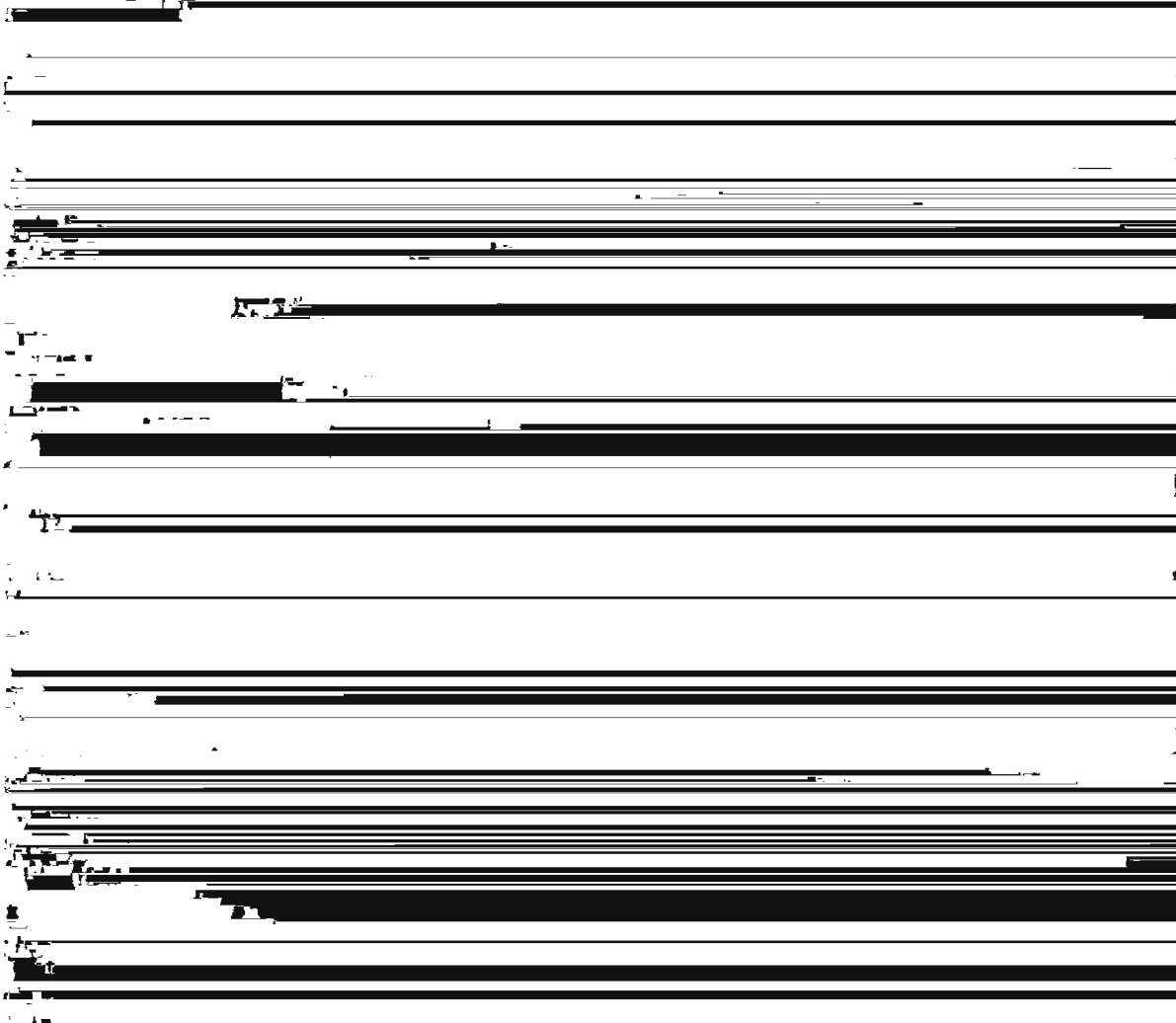

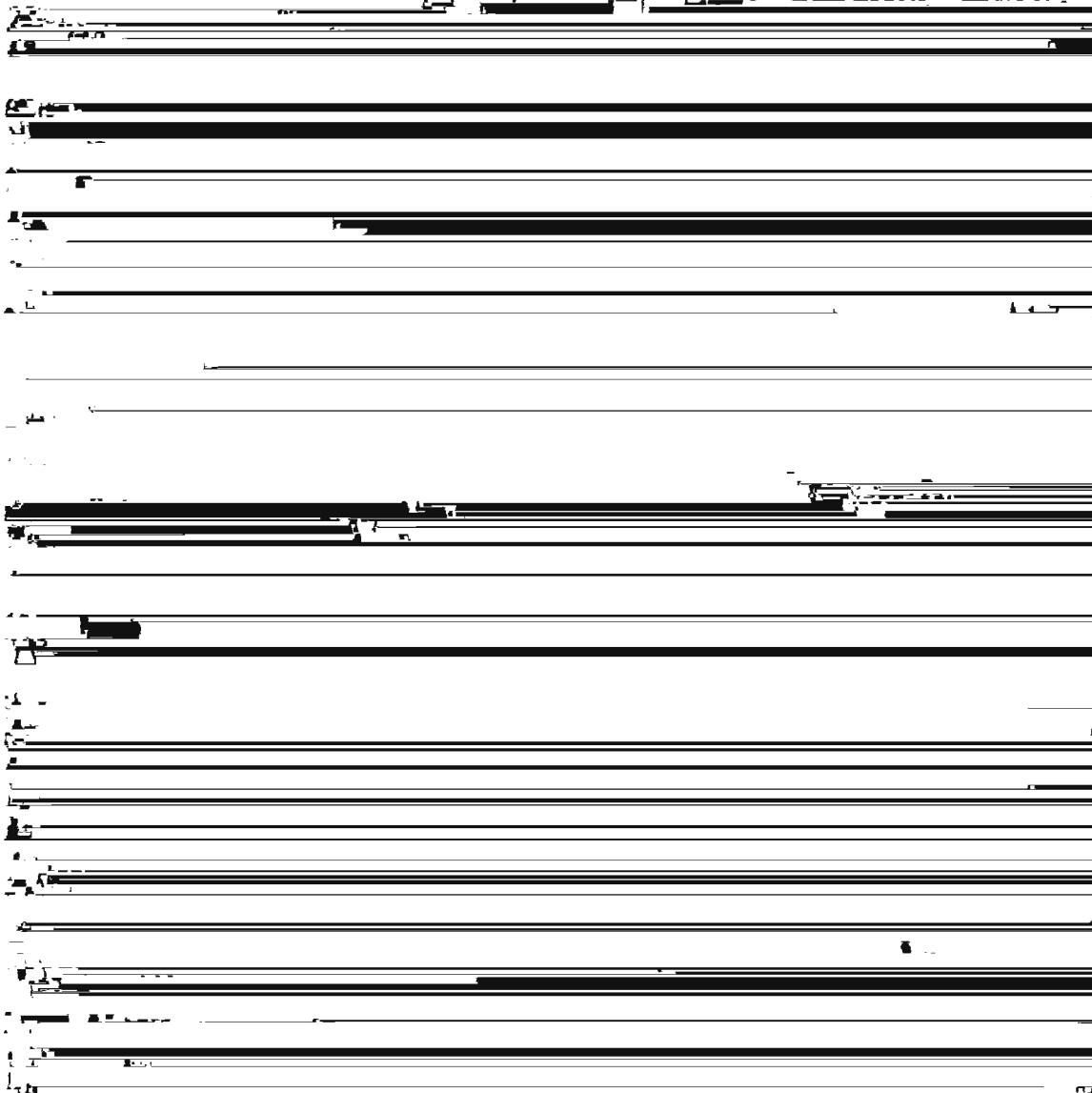

~~ORDER FINDING GIVHAN BULLYING/HARASSMENT COMPLAINT~~  
CK GREENE

In accordance with Policy GAEE, Dr. Angela Givhan (“Givhan”) appeared before the Board to make a statement prior to the Board deliberating upon her bullying/harassment complaint against Dr. Errick Green (“Greene”), superintendent. The Board had also previously received and reviewed the investigative report prepared by board attorney, Dorian Turner, Esq.

During its deliberations, the Board determined that there was no basis to support a claim of bullying or harassment of Givhan by Greene. The process of notifying Givhan of the district reorganization and her options was not handled appropriately by district staff, which was unfortunate, but there was no intent on Greene’s part to bully or harass Givhan. The multiple letters received by Givhan from Greene were not intended to bully or harass her. They were necessitated by district administration’s efforts to ensure Givhan was completely informed about the effects of the reorganization on her position and of her options and to correct mistakes in the initial letters set to Givhan. Additionally, Dr. Kimberly Smith’s copying of her assistant, Lori Harris, on an email to Givhan that contained one of the letters does not support or establish a claim of bullying or harassment by Dr. Greene.

After discussion, Cynthia Thompson moved, and Barbara Hilliard seconded the motion, to adopt an order finding and determining that there was no basis to support a claim of bullying/harassment of Dr. Angela Givhan by Dr. Errick Greene.
